Jasmine was honored to work with both Gordon Ramsay and Christina Tosi, the judges of this FOX television show, as well as with Martha Stewart, Wolfgang Puck, and many others.

Since the show, Jasmine has stayed busy with speaking engagements across the country, Camp MasterChef, an online cooking class called "Jasmine's Delightful Desserts", the Junior Chef Council for Great Wolf's Lodge, and most recently was a part of the MasterChef Junior Live Tour. She has graced the pages of Black Enterprise, Essence, and Atlanta Magazine, and was featured in the Refresh Your Voice campaign for Coca-Cola, in partnership with Blavity. Now 16, Jasmine is an 11th grader who lives in Milton, GA with her parents and older brother, Justin.

Jasmine started her own company, JustJas, LLC, which focuses on girl empowerment and motivational speaking. As a part of that effort, she has created the hashtag, theme, and slogan of "Let Your Inner Girl Slay" which is designed to encourage young girls to be confident and not fear pursuing their inner dreams and
