# IN MEMORIUM - RITA MORROW COWART, 1956-2014




**Rita Cowart**

# CAREER CHANGE A BIG PLUS FOR RYAN COLEMAN

Handcrafted, Top Quality Lures for High-End Bass Fishing

Ryan Coleman returned home to his native Griffin to speak to Rotarians and guests about how his career change allowed him to totally love his work. Coleman was once employed as an engineer tech with Rockwell. When the company relocated, he turned to a new profession that he loved – fishing. Coleman was already living at Lake Lanier and had some success on the Pro Bass Master Tour. "I basically never went back to work," he said of the Rockwell move. He started tournament fishing and established himself as a fishing guide for spotted bass on Lake Lanier. "I offer more of a teaching service," he added. "I teach people how to fish Lake Lanier which is California design lake stuck right here in Georgia." The depth of Lanier provides some challenges to those accustomed to standard bass fishing in southern lakes. Ryan teaches the use of electronic devices as well as techniques to be successful on Lanier. In 2009, Ryan became involved in the fishing lure business beyond that of simply designing and creating lures for his own use. Revenue for several of his lures allowed him to purchase small fishing lure companies. "My basement now looks

like a tackle shop," he said. He designs, creates, builds, and sells top quality lures that are handcrafted from quality materials. Ryan admitted that he did not really plan this direction in his life, but he obviously loves the turn that his career has taken.
